

## INTEL INTERNATIONAL SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING FAIR

### 1) **APPLICATION Deadline: December 1, 2008**

#### **Awards:**

Chapter and Educational Foundation will each contribute \$3,000 to fund the awards – Foundation pays the \$500 registration fee – Chapter provides judges at the event.

Last year: First Place Award of \$2,500; Second Place Award of \$1,500. Also, \$1,000 teaching tool grants awarded to each of the sponsoring high school science departments of our first and second place award winners.

Awards are open to both U.S. and International entrants.

Chapter recommended: additional \$4,000 Team Prize – cost to be divided between Chapter and Foundation.

Chapter recommended: offering internships to winners.

### 2) **2009 location: Reno, Nevada, May 10-15**

#### **Judging:**

Three judges required – names due by April 15, 2009.

NOTE: Judges must have a Ph.D., M.D., or equivalent in degree or have a minimum of six years of teaching or research experience at a university or in industry; should be actively engaged in the field being judged; and should be interested in the career and educational development of young people.

Chapter recommended: Four judges.

**Tuesday, May 12:** No students, no structure. Floor open til 11:30 pm – objective is to narrow down potential projects for visiting/discussion/decision on Wednesday.

**Wednesday, May 13:** 8:30 – 10:00 a.m. to visit projects/talk with students before appointments with Grand Prize Judges begin. Winner decisions can be complete by 1 p.m. Judges mixer (optional) in the evening – 1,000+ judges on site.

**Thursday evening, May 14:** One or two presenters attend 5:00 pm reception with awards following at 7:00 pm. (No other time/personnel commitment required)
