



Stacie Oliver is the Legislative Assistant for Military and Foreign Affairs to U.S. Senator Bob Corker of Tennessee, who serves on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Her issue portfolio includes such issues as: defense policy, arms control, veterans affairs, national security, foreign relations, treaties, intelligence and terrorism. Currently Stacie is working to pass the Military Spouse Education and Employment Act of 2008, which was introduced by Senator Corker in February.
