Tim Huddleston is the Deputy Director for the Infrastructure Information Collection Division (IICD), within the Office of Infrastructure Protection (OIP). His office is responsible for leading the Department's efforts to provide standardized, relevant, and customer-focused infrastructure information and geospatial information services to the homeland security partners.

Mr. Huddleston entered service at DHS as a Security Specialist within the Protective Security Division which evolved into the Risk Management Division. As a Branch Chief, Time led the focused programmatic efforts for infrastructure information collection and maintenance, and was well integrated into the development of programs and processes conducting risk analysis. During the reorganization of the Office of Infrastructure Protection in the Spring of 2007, Tim was selected as the Deputy Director for the newly formed IICD. IICD manages several key national level programs to include the Automated Critical Asset Management System (ACAMS), the Risk Analysis Methodology for Critical Asset Protection (RAMCAP), and the Integrated Common Analytical Viewer (ICAV) which is the DHS enterprise solution for geospatial display.

Prior to DHS, Tim was an Air Force Intelligence Officer with seven years experience in the Special Operations community. After graduating from the United States Air Force Academy and being commissioned in the military, his experience focused on operational intelligence analysis, intelligence collection management, and tactical air and ground mission planning for combat operations in the Middle East, East Africa, and Southeast Asia.
